

Abstract Guidelines for Authors

Preparation of Abstracts

Language

The Abstract should be written in English. Authors whose native language is not English are strongly advised to have their manuscripts checked by an English-speaking colleague prior to submission. Abstracts that do not conform to standard English style, usage or grammar will be returned to the authors for modification prior to scientific review.

Format of text (see example Abstract)

Arial 10 point font

Single spaced

Fully justified, aligned to both left and right margins

One paragraph with no breaks, except Acknowledgements which can be a new paragraph

Title centred and in bold

Author(s) and Affiliation(s) centred

Author(s) name should be First Initial, Middle Initial and Last Name/Surname

Presenting authors should be identified with an asterisk (*)

For authors from multiple institutions, they should be listed as follows:

Figures, tables and footnotes

These are discouraged but if included, must be included in the word count.

Word limit

The total number of words in the complete Abstract submission must be <500 divided into 50 words for Authors and Affiliations and 450 words for Title and Abstract. The 450 word count includes every word in the Title, Abstract, Acknowledgements, References, Figures, Tables etc. Please consider that for an Abstract, Affiliations can be kept much shorter than for a full paper. Please also note that the on-line abstract submission system counts the number of words differently to the Word programme.

References

These are included in the total word count of the complete Abstract. References should be written in line with the text (not as a separate section) and the format should be minimal. Example:

Squires.et.al. Animal Reproduction. 2005; 58:211-213

The final decision about Abstract acceptance will be made by the Chair of the ISER International Committee and Guest Editor, Professor Christine Aurich, in consultation with Dr Ed Squires, Editor of the Journal of Equine Veterinary Science.

Publication of Abstracts

Accepted abstracts will be published prior to the symposium in a Supplement to the Journal of Equine Veterinary Science (JEVS). Please submit your abstracts via the link on the ISER website *not* through the JEVS system.
